

This is hard to believe we are in the final month of the year, but one of the best months celebrating Jesus' birthday! We are truly blessed to be able to do that freely!


We have a lot to be thankful for and we could not do it without each other. I for one am blessed to have such support and understanding as I get to know you and the church.

WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY - All women of the congregation are welcome to join us on Thursday, December 12th from 7 - 8 pm. "The Proverbs 31 Women and the Stories of Faithful Women in Scripture" study has been misunderstood and misrepresented throughout ages. The women described in these verses sound like the Martha Stewart of King Solomon's court – an unattainable ideal of perfection – or perhaps a quaint example of ages past. However, this study is about more than some imagined ideal of womanhood. It will explore real women, with real struggles and gifts – women with deep, abiding faith and a passion for the will of God. The truth is that neither the women of Scripture nor we ourselves are called to be like Martha Stewart; we are called to be like Christ. Session 6-The Story of Bathsheba: A Proverbs 31 woman is one who recognizes the gifts God has given and uses them to His glory; she is properly qualified. Proverbs 31:25 says "Strength and dignity are her clothing, and she laughs at the time to come." God gives us many gifts which we use to accomplish the tasks set before us. This quality is not something we can get for ourselves. It comes from God. God gives Prudence to the simple. Prudence is good judgment in practical matters, and this good judgment comes from wisdom and discipline from God. In faith we know that we are always under the holy wings of our Lord and competently deal with both the good and bad that come our way.

<u>CHOIR</u> practices are on **Monday nights** at **6 pm**. We welcome more voices to join us!




HANDBELL CHOIR practices are on Wednesday afternoons at 5 pm.



THE MITTEN TREE is up and the **TOYS FOR TOTS** box is out and both are ready for your donations.





There were members who requested to vote by absentee ballot at the last congregational meeting. Currently our church constitution and by-laws do not allow absentee ballot voting.

Church Council discussed at our last meeting proposed constitution and by-laws changes that would allow voting members who would like to vote by absentee ballot to do so when they cannot be in attendance at the congregational meeting because of being homebound, current health reasons, vacations, family obligations, etc.

Below are the proposed constitution and by-laws changes that will be voted on at the annual congregational meeting in January 2025.

CONSTITUTION PROPOSED CHANGES

C6.02. This Congregation, in order to further its mission and ministry, may choose to affiliate with other Lutheran bodies as deemed appropriate with the vote of a two-thirds majority of the voting members present at a legally called and conducted meeting of the congregation.

C6.02. This Congregation, in order to further its mission and ministry, may choose to affiliate with other Lutheran bodies as deemed appropriate with the vote of a two-thirds majority of the voting members present at a legally called and conducted meeting of the congregation.

C6.03. This Congregation may dissolve any affiliation with the vote of a two-thirds majority of the voting members present at a legally called and conducted meeting of the congregation.

C7.02. Real property shall not be purchased, disposed of, or encumbered in any manner except by resolution adopted by not less than a two-thirds (2/3) majority ballot vote of the members present at a legally called meeting of the congregation.

C8.02. Members shall be classified as follows:

a. be approved at a legally called meeting according to this constitution by a majority vote of voting members present;

a. be approved at a legally called meeting according to this constitution by a majority vote of voting members present;

b. be ratified without change at the next annual meeting by a two-thirds majority vote of voting members *present*; and

BY-LAWS PROPOSED CHANGES

B8.02.c. Voting Members

The Congregation Council shall determine the roster of voting members of the congregation in accordance with the provisions of the constitution and by-laws.

A voting member shall be regarded as being "in good standing" as defined by the following requirements:

Those who partake of Holy Communion and make a contribution of record to the congregational treasury during the current or preceding year, and

Those who participate in the life and ministry of the congregation.

B8.02.c. Voting Members

The Congregation Council shall determine the roster of voting members of the congregation in accordance with the provisions of the constitution and by-laws.

A voting member shall be regarded as being "in good standing" as defined by the following requirements:

Those who partake of Holy Communion of record and

Make a contribution of record to the congregational treasury during the current or preceding year. and

Those who participate in the life and ministry of the congregation.

Absentee ballots will be provided upon request by any voting member. Absentee ballots must be received by the church office no later than noon on the Thursday before a Sunday congregational meeting. The absentee ballot would be an unapproved ballot without any changes/nominations from the congregation at the meeting; an absentee ballot would have no room for changes or write-ins.

Absentee ballots would have an attached signature page that would be detached by the church secretary. The absentee ballot would be date stamped and then be certified by the secretary with her initials on the ballot, and be given to the committee on Sunday for inclusion in the vote count. Ballots, absentee ballots, uncertified absentee ballots and signature pages would all be kept together and filed according to office procedures.
